

In 2014, the rate of violent victimization against persons with disabilities (31.7 victimizations per 1,000 persons age 12 or older) was 2.5 times higher than the age-adjusted rate for persons without disabilities (12.5 per 1,000). Every year between 2009 and 2014, the rate of violent victimiza-

tion against persons with disabilities was at least twice that for persons without disabilities. After an increase in the rate of violent victimization for both persons with and without disabilities between 2011 and 2012, the rate

remained steady through 2014. —> <u>Full Report</u>

Guardians Is Unknown, but Some Measures Exist to Help Protect Older Adults On November 16, 2016 the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) published their findings on whether or not abusive practices by guardians are widespread. Their findings indicated that the extent of elder abuse by guardians nationally is unknown due to limited data on key factors related to elder abuse by a guardian. Court officials from six selected states GAO spoke to noted various data limitations that prevent them from being able to provide reliable figures about elder abuse by guardi-

ans. Some efforts are under way to try to collect better data on elder abuse and guardianship at the federal, state, and local levels to support decision making and help prevent and address elder abuse by guardians


