#### nation's 65 million Social Security beneficiaries would receive a 0.3% cost-ofliving adjustment (COLA) to their monthly checks in 2017. Medicare Part B premiums are typically deducted from Social Security beneficiaries' monthly checks, so the net effect of the COLA and the Part B premium increase is that

Some seven in 10 of the 53.5 million Medicare Part B beneficiaries can breathe a collective sigh of relief. Their monthly Part B premium will rise a relatively modest 3.9% in 2017. Most of the rest will see their Part B premiums jump

70% of Part B beneficiaries won't see any increase at all in their Social Security checks. They'll receive an extra \$5 per month, but that money will go straight to Medicare to pay for their Part B premiums. Because of the "hold harmless" provision covering 70% of beneficiaries, premiums for the remaining 30% must cover most of the increase in Medicare costs for 2017 for all beneficiaries.
